## "Rise" Spring Retreat

"Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in His name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things." ~ Luke 24: 46-48

During this season of Lent, we prepare for the Lord's Resurrection at Easter through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. You are invited to attend our Spring Retreat "Rise" beginning on the evening of **Friday**, **April 12** through Mass on **Saturday**, **April 13**. Let's turn what we experienced during Lent into action in our life. During the retreat, we will have time for reflection, Adoration, Reconciliation, Eucharist and inspiring presentations by Bishop Williams, Ryan O'Hara and Father Paul. While participants of small groups are being encouraged to attend this retreat as a follow-up to their small group experience, this parish-wide retreat is open to any parishioner who would like to attend. Childcare will be available on Saturday and additional details of the retreat are being finalized and will be published as they are available.

We are called to be holy, but we live in a broken world that draws us away from the plans that God has for us, "plans for your welfare and not for woe, so as to give you a future of hope." (Jer. 29:11). It can be challenging to live a holy life, given the condition of the world around us. We can find that we are just "going with the flow" and end up in a place we don't want to be. It's important to be intentional in living a holy life and surrounding ourselves with holy people. "Rise" will explore the condition of today's world, one that was "once deeply Christian and now that by a slow and thorough process has been ridding itself of its Christian basis" and the voices that draw us into sin and away from God's hopeful plan for us; not life without trials but living with the strength that comes from God to overcome the challenges we face.

Why retreat? Retreats give us an opportunity to remove ourselves from the normal rhythm of our lives, to get away from the noise and daily distractions and examine the rhythm of our faith life, giving us a chance to recenter and commit our lives fully to God. Over the years, I have found retreats to be essential to living a holy life. In addition to my year as a NET Missionary, I have experienced retreats of various shapes and sizes: long and short, silent (this was a challenge for me), men only, married couples and more. There were times when I didn't know why I was going, or even resisted the invitation, but without fail, at the end of the retreat, I received a gift from God that brought me deeper into my faith and in closer relationship with Him.

Why retreat NOW? This retreat is meant to fortify the graces received in the Lenten season. The retreat is also an opportunity to encounter the risen Jesus who is alive. If you've been through a spiritual exercise like a season of small groups or deep Lenten reflection, there can be a temptation to return to life as before and abandon the journey you'd begun. Don't take the journey alone. Surround yourself with people who are also striving to live a faithful life in Christ, so that we may accompany each other on our journey to holiness.

"Gather to Witness" and join us for "Rise" and put your Lenten reflections into action.


