

From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain



This weekend, we welcome the shepherd of our whole Archdiocese, Archbishop Hebda, to celebrate Palm Sunday with us at the 10:30 am Mass. You will note we wear red today as Palm Sunday is the first day of Holy Week and we do this to honor Jesus's Passion and the blood that He willingly offered for our eternal salvation.

"Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." Jesus reveals to us that we are called to make a gift of ourselves. Society tends to encourage selfcenteredness, rather than sacrifice. This leads to selfishness and treating others as a threat or an inconvenience. We have seen this in our state this past year with the terrible pro-death laws that have been passed regarding abortion. Currently, the state government is considering furthering the culture of death as it considering passing a physician assisted suicide bill into law. This law would further weaken the value of human life. It sees those who are infirm as a burden rather a gift. With Christ we see that suffering can in fact be redemptive and help us on the journey to Heaven. In fact, Christ was not afraid of suffering but entered into it. He freely embraced death on the cross and scourging before that. In that suffering, He continued to remain united to the Father seeking to die without sin. Thus, He was able to unlock the gates of Heaven for us.

We must oppose the physician assisted suicide bill (*HF 1930/SF 1813*) and encourage our legislators and governor to vote against it. We must also fast and pray for the bill to not be passed. We must also work at gathering and witnessing to the value of human life. We do this with our prayer on the bridge. We just had a sign made and you can see pictured below. We want to help people see that ALL human life matters, from womb to tomb. We continue to build a culture of life at SJB. We have installed the diaper stations in the bathrooms in the church and parish center. We installed the adult changing table to help families who bring children with special needs. We are going to build a nursing mothers area near the Garden of Life Chapel. We offer the expectant parent blessing 4 times a year and now at both morning Masses those weekends. We work to remind the elderly and ill of their beautiful dignity by bringing them Holy Communion and spending time with them at many care facilities and homes. Most recently one of our parishioners wrote Governor Walz requesting March to be Trisomy 18 Awareness month. Much to our surprise it was granted. (See the note from Tim and Jodi Sandquist on page 9.) So there is hope and we must be involved in the political process and work to establish laws that protect life.

As we journey though Lent, may the Lord fill us with His grace as we offer up our sacrifices to build a culture of

life. Pray for life. Protect life. Love life. Save life. Together may we work together to show respect for every person from the unborn, to those burdened with much suffering.





March is Trisomy Awareness Month and now it has been made official as a Proclamation in the State of Minnesota. What is Trisomy? "Trisomy is the presence within a person's cells of a single extra chromosome, yielding a total of three chromosomes instead of a pair. As a type of aneuploidy, trisomy can occur with any of the 23 pairs of chromosomes individuals have." We requested this proclamation at the Governor's Office in memory of our daughter Amelia Lynn Sandquist, who had Trisomy 18. This proclamation stands for many things, raising awareness and educating people about Trisomy, sharing the many resources that are out there for families facing this diagnosis, and honoring the stories that God has writ-

ten for each child and family affected or will be affected by Trisomy.

Our daughter Amelia (top picture on the right) was loved, honored and valued but this isn't always the case. There is so much misinformation out there but raising awareness and being informed will help us to see what God sees in every life, choosing faith over our fears.
