#### Restore to Gather Project Update

Greetings and prayers for a wonderful Easter season to all!

As I reported several weeks ago, some portions of our *Restore to Gather* projects have begun, some have vendors and plans in place, and other parts are in the planning stage. Since we launched the campaign in the fall of 2023, the Administrative Services Commission has led our efforts to review and refine exactly what improvements will best serve our church and school. This process has affirmed our decision to implement needed upgrades as listed below.

I'm happy to report that we have signed a contract with JT Egner Construction for the church interior for the following improvements:

Project	Description
Church ceiling	Apply new acoustical treatment & clean diffusers
Church HVAC	Install new equipment to replace aging and outdated mechanicals
Sound System	Utilize latest technology to improve listener experience for music and spoken word
Pews and Kneelers	Refinish pews and bevel the leading edge of seats. Replace kneelers. Repair book racks and envelope holders and match to the pews.
Terrazzo Floors	Clean and polish terrazzo floor

Other projects with plans underway and/or currently in negotiation:

Project	Description	
Stained glass above the Baptistry	Replace two cracked interior panes	
Church Air conditioning unit Reserve funds for future replacement of church chillin		
East Parking Lot	Resurface and re-stripe east lot for handicapped parking	
School Restrooms	Upgrade and renovate 70 year-old restroom facilities	
School Carpeting	Replace worn and stained carpet	
School Playground	Install rubber surface for safety and improved maintenance	
School Operations Endowment	Establish a perpetual fund for school operations	

We are tracking the expenses of the contracted and planned items, and we are confident we can accomplish all of this within the generosity of our *Restore to Gather* donors. A more comprehensive financial summary will be provided once the larger planned pieces are decided and contracted later this spring. Please note, however, that early Finance Commission review of our campaign and project cash flow indicates that we may need to create a line of credit to complete the projects this year. If enough donors fulfill their campaign pledges sooner rather than later, it can substantially reduce our need to use a line of credit. Our parish leadership, in the form of our Administrative Services, Finance, Worship, Parish Development and School Advisory Commissions and our Parish Pastoral Leadership Council, will be guiding the planning, review and communication of necessary project and financial decisions.

### **Restore to Gather Project Update (continued)**

Below is our estimated timeline for the church interior projects:

Project timeline	Sunday Mass location	Project description
Phase I (May 6 – June 30)	Church – seating in center and eastside pews	Pews removed on the west side and one quarter of the west center section, scaf- folding placed, ceiling restored, floor polished, and sound system installed. Refinished pews re-installed.
Phase II (July 1 – August 31)	St. Joseph's Hall	Center section pews removed and reno- vation completed as above
Phase III (September 1 – October 31)	Church – seating in center and westside pews	Eastside pews removed and renovation completed as above

Please note that the music and choir area of the church will be inaccessible during Phase I. The musicians and choir members will be relocated elsewhere in the church during this time. Daily Mass will be in the chapel beginning that first week of May. At least one confessional will also be closed for much of this time; a suitable second confession location will be determined.

While our church interior is being renewed, we will experience some short-term inconvenience. Please remember, however, that the long-term gain will be substantial—a restored space to gather to worship our Lord and celebrate the Mass together as a community!

It is helpful to recall Father Paul's message to all of us in his homily on our *Restore to Gather* Commitment Weekend January 20/21:

• Pray for the success of this campaign, our planning, the safety of the workers and God's blessings on all of our efforts.

• Be flexible as we navigate the changes we will experience through the renovation process—changes in our music ministry, the location of our Masses and our confessionals, the presence of scaffolding and other signs of work in our sacred space.

• Make a commitment to *Restore to Gather* if you have not done so already, and please continue to support our Sunday offertory so we can remain financially strong as a parish community.

This entire project, from its funding through its planning all the way to its completion, is truly a St. John the Baptist community effort. What a blessing it has been to see the work of God carried out by so many gifted people. Thank you all!


Invite parishioners to reflect on their journey of discipleship.

#### Questions of the Week

**First Reading:** Peter challenges the religious leaders of Jerusalem who put Jesus to death to repent of their sins and be converted. Have you ever seen someone have a conversion to the Faith?

**Second Reading:** John tells us that we should turn to Jesus, our Advocate, when we sin and fail to keep his commandments. Can you think of a time when you sought Jesus in a time of need?
