From Director of Catechesis: Jill Fink



"I am the Good Shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me." ~ John 10:14

Of all the I AM statements that our Lord reveals to us, it is the I am the Good Shepherd that tugs at my heart the most. Whether giving a presentation to our preschool children in our atrium utilizing the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program, to a study with our adults in Becoming Catholic OCIA to attending a funeral and hearing the comforting words of the Good Shepherd preparing a place of rest and peace, this image of Jesus being sent to shepherd his people incarnationally, tangibly, personally to each person strikes the heart of every age of the disciple. All ages called into disciple-ship are guided, protected, and comforted by the Good Shepherd.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, we are challenged by our shepherd with these words:


"I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock and one shepherd." *John 10:16*

Jesus desires to shepherd all into one flock. His hands and feet are his disciples. He calls his disciples to be on mission to go out and seek those who are lost and in need of His shepherding. Our theme for this year, Gather to Witness, challenges us to witness our Catholic faith to others, to introduce them to the love of the Good Shepherd, and welcome them into the one flock of the Church. One of the most influential ways we do this is to have a testimony ready of why we are a disciple of Jesus Christ. I love the words from 1 Peter 3:15, "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope." What is the reason for your hope? How has the Good Shepherd called you? How can you witness to another person to bring them into the flock of the Church?

Our parish is participating in the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) survey which will ask you to reflect on your journey of faith as well as answer questions about how St. John's is providing an environment of discipleship. Fr. Paul is encouraging every adult in the parish to take the time to complete this brief survey to benefit your own understanding of your spiritual growth as well as to help our staff chart the path forward in discipleship efforts. The survey is brief, confidential and open for just thirty days, so complete it soon.

Together may we hear and follow the voice of the Good Shepherd in being the missionary disciple He desires us to be here at St. John's.

Intercessory Prayer Ministry



Ministry Spotlight

St. John's Food Shelf

We are blessed to have our own food shelf right here at St. John's in the storage room next to the kitchen. We distribute nonperishable food products, personal care items and detergents.

The food shelf was started in about 2000 and has grown over the years. It is currently staffed with 33 dedicated volunteers.

In response to the Covid 19 pandemic, the food shelf began accepting online food orders and paper orders available at church in April of 2021. The orders are



filled by volunteers and picked up by clients at church.

The food shelf is available to anyone who struggles to buy food and lives within the Mounds View school district or is a member of St. John's parish.

The food shelf is open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 10:00 am – Noon for walk-ins. Online orders are accepted through the St. John's website at stjohnnb.com/community-outreach/food-shelf. Paper orders are available in the kiosk near the welcome desk and can be turned in at the office. Orders may be picked up on Monday, Wednesday or Friday afternoon or evening.

Emergency food bags are also available for the staff to give out in case a person has an immediate need for food outside of food shelf hours.

Although it is called a food shelf, some of the most sought-after items include detergents, soap, shampoo, and paper towels.

Thanks to your generous support and the support of St. John's school children, in the last year, the food shelf gave out 16,495 pounds of groceries to 103 households, and, in addition, donated 5,542 pounds of excess groceries to the Ralph Reeder food shelf.

Donations of nonperishable food, personal care items or detergents can be dropped off in the wooden bins near the church entrances. The box near the west entrance is in the coat room. We also accept cash donations to purchase items that are in short supply.

Thank you for helping to feed the hungry by donating to our food shelf.




