- Sacramental Celebration. The Easter season brings celebration of the sacraments after a yearlong preparation. At the Easter Vigil we welcomed one adult in baptism and 15 for confirmation and first Communion. We also welcomed the son of one of our candidates for his first Communion. On Sunday, April 7, at the 10:30 am Mass we celebrated two baptisms and six first Communions for our older students enrolled in RCIC. On Tuesday, April 16, 40 of our students enrolled in our confirmation program received the sacrament at the Cathedral of Saint Paul. The weekend of May 4/5 we will welcome 55 of our second graders to their first Communion.
- **Peer Mentor Learning.** At our May Formation Night on Wednesday, May 1, the last half of our evening will be a sharing from our middle school students presenting to the elementary children on what they have learned throughout the year. Grade 6 will make mini presentations on times in salvation history and grades 7-8 will lead the children through the mysteries of the rosary. This peer mentoring learning has become a highlight for our different age groups, enabling them to teach one another. The elementary ages learn from the older students and the middle school students practice leadership skills while relaying what they have learned to the younger students.

- Marriage Ministry. Two additional Engaged Couple Mentors have been added to the marriage prep ministry with four more soon to come (two by May 1 and two more in June). These new mentors have accepted engaged couples to mentor in the preparation process. Marriage Minute, a marriage enrichment program, will happen on the third Sunday of the month between the morning Masses beginning in May. The first sessions include: May: Rituals of Connection, June: The Emotional Bank Account and July: Admiration.
- **Pastoral Care.** Training for the Ministry of Consolation came off successfully with 10 people trained at this session with an additional six to be trained later. Some of the attendees are part of other pastoral care ministries (including two from Wounded Heart, a trauma ministry) who found that this training was applicable and foundational to other ministries.
