# 2024 St. John the Baptist Catholic Church Renovation Tour Guide



1. The ceiling has a fresh coat of acoustical spray that helps with being able to hear both music and the spoken word. The skylight wells and vents were given a fresh coat of paint which brightens the entire space with the beautiful white ceiling.

2. The fire suppression system was upgraded with new sprinkler heads that help reduce risk and minimize the possibility of leaking as they age.

3. The new sound system has amazing power and capabilities that will help everyone enter into the sacrifice of the Mass. We upgraded the microphones used by the clergy as well as the two handhelds to match the new high quality.\*



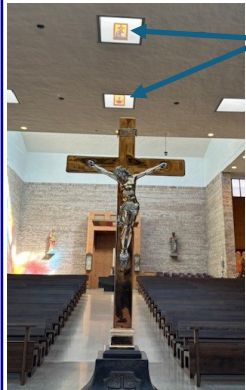
There are also new hearing assistance devices located near the upper sacristy that assist those with hearing loss. These include half moon ear speakers, ear buds, headsets and neck loops. There are directions at the station on how to use them.

4. The pews were run through a planer, sanded down, and refinished to the original darker color. Their fresh look brings added beauty to the space. The kneelers were replaced as the old wooden kneelers were failing. The book racks were rebuilt to close the gap that previously existed after a modification. The envelope holders were refinished and now match the pews.\*





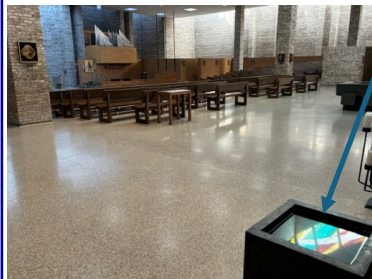
- The floors were polished and their shine adds to the splendor of the space. There is good traction as they were ground to a texture that allows people to walk confidently on them, even on the slanted ramp.
- The Stations of the Cross were enhanced with frames that were made from the old kneeler wood. Their frames match the previously existing frames around the icons of the evangelists that are on the pillars by the confessionals.



8. Two icons were written and installed in the skylights above the main aisle. The clergy are able to view these as they look up at the host and chalice during consecration. They are beautiful invitations to contemplate the heavenly mysteries that are present at Mass.



9. The stones in the sanctuary, including the pulpit, altar, presider chair, deacon seat, server seat and cantor stand were cleaned thoroughly adding to the transcendence of the sanctuary. The baptismal font was cleaned and treated with a color enhancer to bring forth its beauty.



10. The stone holy water fountains, previously by the south exit doors, were cleaned and moved to the north entrances. The touchless holy water dispensers, previously on the confessionals were moved to the south doors.



11. Although it is not visible in the sanctuary, the heating and cooling ventilation systems were given many upgrades including new belts, motors, coils, controls, air filtration system and bearings. These improvements will increase efficiency and reduce utility cost.



- We have added 2 kneelers in the front of the church along the center aisle to give people the opportunity to kneel safely as they receive Holy Communion. These also can be used for people to pray at when they stop in our beautifully renovated church!
- The icons of St. John the Baptist and Mary, the Mother of God, rotated locations as Mary is to be given the place of honor which is to the right of the throne (the Tabernacle) looking out at the congregation.

**Thank you for your generous support of these upgrades!**

**\* Please note there is still work yet to be done on the sound system, lights, installing the book racks, and plugging the holes on the pews where the bolts fasten them to the floor.**
