St. Paul's Transformative Theology of the Eucharist

This past week, Fr. Paul, Dcn. Tom, Dcn. Rod, and I had the opportunity to hear Dr. Michael Barber from the Augustine Institute teach on the Theology of St. Paul at our Archdiocesan Clergy Study Day. With our parish's initiative to think more deeply about the many ways God transforms us, I couldn't help but see this reality come alive in St. Paul's writings, but especially in what Paul writes about the celebration of the Eucharist.

The Apostle Paul is often referenced as "The" Apostle for two reasons. For one, he unpacked for the Church some of our deepest understandings of the theology of Christ, but equally important was how he modeled his life after Christ and lived as a spiritual father to the many communities he pastored. As Pope Francis says, "his pastoral heart drove him to make himself all things to all people." Paul shows us that pastoral care and theology go hand in hand and lead us into a deeper relationship with the Triune God.

Of all the words Jesus spoke, Jesus' words of Institution at the Last Supper are the only words Paul chooses to directly reference and preach on in his letters. In doing so, Paul as a spiritual father hands on to the communities the theology of what we today call the liturgy of the Mass (1 Corinthians 11:23-26). This ongoing memorial sacrifice fulfills what the Old Testament Covenant was pointing to in Jesus Christ, but also by Jesus' command we are to continually celebrate (Luke 22:18-20) and be partakers of true worship as what was foretold from of old (Jeremiah 31:31-33 and Psalm 50:5).

Thoroughly our faith is grounded in the theology of a New Covenant Sacrifice, but we don't think too much about this concept, most often because the world today proclaims a radical message of autonomy, and it seems to hang in the air we breathe. Certainly, the dignity of the person and the gift of man's free will is tremendously important, but how dismal would our lives be if we never died to self so that there might be room for something more? For a parent, what would love be if it never gave itself away in sacrifice? This is exactly what God is doing for His people in the Old Covenant sacrifice (Exodus 24:5-8) and is ultimately brought into completion in Christ. This New Covenant sacrifice is inaugurated when Jesus instituted the liturgy of the Mass at the Last Supper and seals it in his love and very life on the cross. His words of "do this in remembrance of me" is a command that we celebrate the Mass as a perpetual living "sacrificial banquet" until the end of the age.

Just as Moses sprinkled the blood of the Old Covenant on the altar and on the people to ratify God's unbinding promise with his people and they ate of the sacrificial meal offered, so too do we participate in something even greater in the Mass, for there we are sealed with Christ's precious blood and eat of his body so that what sin has destroyed, our current lives might be transformed and we look forward to having eternal life in him (Romans 3:24-25).

As a parish, we have been seeking to unpack the many ways God transforms us. Being partakers of holy Mass, we become one body mystically united to Christ in a way that we will only fully appreciate in the life to come (1 Cor 12:12-13). Considering this reality, the opportunities to allow Christ to enter all parts of your life is endless! What spiritual offerings do you wish to bring to the altar? How about all of what you gave of yourself as a parent this past week, or maybe the joys and sorrows of your life, perhaps your prayer intentions, or the unfulfilled desires of your heart. We all have something to give, and it is awaiting to be transformed so that we might receive something new and life giving. When you give it to Jesus and listen to what he wants to do with it, it all can be transformed and conformed to his divine life. You have an active role to play in the redemption of the world, to give your entire lives as a pleasing sacrifice of love (Romans 12:1).

Monthly Saint Spotlight

Pope Saint John Paul II

1920 ~ 2005 (age 84)

Pope Saint John Paul II, born Karol Józef Wojtyła on May 18, 1920, in Wadowice, Poland, was a towering figure in the history of the Catholic Church. His early years were marked by personal tragedy and the trials of World War II. After losing his mother, father, and older brother by the age of 21, Wojtyła faced the harsh realities of Nazi occupation and Soviet domination in Poland. Undeterred by these challenges, he pursued priestly studies in secret during the war, eventually being ordained a priest in 1946. His profound intellect and pastoral dedication quickly distinguished him, leading to his appointment as Auxiliary Bishop of Kraków in 1958 and later as Archbishop in 1964.

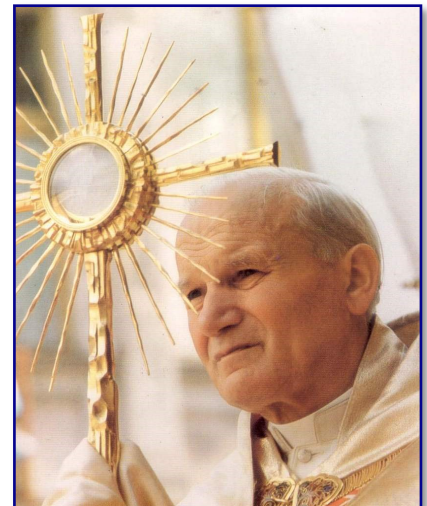


The pivotal moment in his life came on October 16, 1978, when he was elected as the 264th Pope of the Roman Catholic Church, taking the name John Paul II. His papacy was marked by an extraordinary global presence and reformative zeal. John Paul II played a crucial role in the political landscape of Eastern Europe, especially in his native Poland, where his support for the Solidarity movement significantly contributed to the collapse of communist regimes. His global outreach was equally impressive, as he traveled extensively, visiting over 100 countries and addressing issues such as human rights, poverty, and interfaith dialogue. His efforts to foster relationships with leaders of other religions and his profound impact on the global political stage highlighted his unique approach to papal leadership.

His ability to connect with the faithful through the liturgy was a testament to his belief in the Mass as the central axis of Christian life and community. His dedication to the Eucharist was not merely a personal devotion but a cornerstone of his papal ministry, reflecting his understanding of the Mass as the ultimate expression of divine love and the foundation of the Church's mission in the world.
